

Why do ladybirds play such an important role in the organic garden? How many aphids do you think a ladybird's larvae has the potential to eat?






Grass Snake

Toad

Woodlouse

Have a look under different stones, logs or leaves to see if you can find a woodlouse

If you find the wooden millipede in the garden, see if you can count how many legs it has.




Fruit Fly
